On Wednesday February 25,

Christians around the world will gather to be marked with ashes on the forehead. This temporary ash cross will mark their commitment to Christ. It's a way of saying, "I belong to God."

Of course, ashes are also a mark of your spiritual journey through the 40 days that led Christ to the cross and beyond, ultimately to Easter. Ashes are a kind of symbol of grief. . . grief for the things you said or did that you know were not favorable in His sight. Still you are His and you bring Him your commitment as you walk to the cross with Him.

Meet you in the sanctuary on Wed. Feb. 25 at 6:15 p.m. In our brief (30-min) service, we will receive the imposition of ashes at one of the four separate stations and be marked as His. At that time I will also give you a small pewter coin depicting a crown of thorns. You might place it on your keychain or put it in your pocket for these next 40 days to remind you of His great love and sacrifice for you.
