The Holy Bible is the revelation of God’s love for us! It begins with God’s creative love and concludes with the revelation of God’s gracious love in Jesus Christ. Although we speak of the Bible as having two testaments, the revelation they proclaim is the same: God is a gracious, caring God who desires that we live an abundant life of faith, hope, and love. The mission and ministry of Jesus is understood more fully as we see it in the context and knowledge of the Old Testament.

In a few weeks a new short-termed Disciple Bible Study entitled “An Invitation to the Old Testament” will begin at PUMC. Two groups will journey through the Old Testament, seeking to understand more fully God’s revelation to us. Each group will meet in the Conference Room in the Crossway (Office Building). The Study begins with an Orientation Class offered on August 21 and 22. Each participant will receive a study manual (\$9).

Music Notes



A Note About Sunday's Anthem.....

The text for this Sunday's anthem, *And Can It Be*, is one of two autobiographical hymns composed by Charles Wesley following his conversion in May of 1738. The words of this great hymn celebrate Charles Wesley's conversion experience and are often referred to as the "national anthem" of Methodism.

*And can it be that I should gain,
 An interest in the Savior's blood!
 Died he for me? Who caused his pain!
 For me? Who him to death pursued?
 Amazing love! How can it be,
 That thou, my God, shouldst die for me?*

Although this particular Charles Wesley hymn has been in hymnals for over two hundred years, it was seldom sung until it was reintroduced in the 1960's to the tune of SAGINA, composed by Thomas Campbell. SAGINA comes from a collection of twenty-three original tunes from Campbell's *Bouquet*, which was published in London in 1825. All twenty-three tunes in Campbell's *Bouquet* have botanical names after the title of the collection.

Sagina is a Latin word meaning nourishment. It also describes a small herb that grew in abundance on the thin, rocky soil of the plains surrounding Rome. The Sagina plant provided abundant spring nourishment for flocks of sheep pastured there for fattening.

The 1982 United Methodist Hymnal (page 363) was one of the first to publish Charles Wesley's text, *And Can It Be*, with Thomas Campbell's tune, SAGINA. Just as the Sagina plant provided nourishment for the sheep of Rome, this hymn provides nourishment to the soul today through the words of Charles Wesley.

The setting to be presented by the Sanctuary Choir on Sunday is arranged by Albin Whitworth, organist at Asbury Theological Seminary in Wilmore, Kentucky.
